# Banquet Raises \$115,000 for Life

THANK YOU FOR SHINING LIFE IN THE COMMUNITY

Our 11th Annual Fundraising Banquet was held on Thursday, April 27th, at the Ashland University Convo, with about 450 in attendance. Our guest speaker, Pastor

We spoke of many needs; one urgent need in particular was to find funding to provide the necessary training for an additional ultrasound sonographer for our new 4D/5D ultrasound machine. God responded through a generous donor. Two days after the banquet, a donor came forward and committed to cover the expenses of \$6,000.00 for training. Praise the Lord!

We had about 45-50 first-time donors, 12 new banquet sponsors that helped underwrite the event, and more churches and new churches in attendance that hosted tables. We also had 15 new individuals who were called to serve as volunteers.

Through the generosity of all who attended and gave faithfully, we are excited to report that we raised about \$115,000 in one-time gifts and monthly support. That is a \$15,000 increase from last year! Thank you for helping us continue to "Let LIFE Shine" in our community.

### Dear Friends,

# Free Baby Boxes Available to Prevent Sids

### BABY BOXES OFFER SAFE SLEEP ENVIROMENT TO SAVE BABIES

A new initiative in the state of Ohio, the Baby Box Program, has launched in Ashland County. Ashland Care Center, together with Ashland County Health Dept., University Hospitals, Catholic Charities, and others are helping curb infant death by offering a safe sleep environment.

Baby Boxes, a simple cardboard box with a mattress pad are free for expectant parents. Parents must complete an online 15-20 minute SIDS education and parenting class at **babyboxuniveristy.com**, print off the certificate, and bring it to any of the participating agencies listed above to pick up their free Baby Box. The boxes are filled with a starter kit of diapers, wipes, and other helpful resources.

Baby Boxes are a temporary short-term option that can sleep one baby up to 3 months old, and can be used as a storage box after the baby is grown. For families that do not have a computer, appointments can be made at the


